# **ROCIO DIAZ**




Rocio produced the concert Bringing Human Rights Home and the Shine a light on Human Rights award ceremony along many others.





### **OVERVIEW**

Somos Valientes is a multimedia educational project focused on the education for peace model. The project offers practical tools to promote a new vision of the eradication of violence from the voices and eyes of children. Somos Valientes seeks to change the narrative and the conventional meaning of courage to link it to solidarity actions away from war and violence.

Somos Valientes is comprised of a web docuseries in five chapters, with interviews of children from five states in Mexico about the issues that cause conflict, violence and fear, and the solutions that boys and girls bravely discover, as well as a free web-based platform that hosts the docu-series and additional education for peace tools such as videos, readings, activities, and games to learn to mediate family, school and community conflicts









### **OVERVIEW**

The songs of Bob Dylan honoring 50 Years of Amnesty International is a charity compilation album featuring new recordings of compositions by Bob Dylan by multiple artists, released on January 24, 2012. Proceeds from the album were donated to the human rights organization Amnesty International. It debuted in the U.S at number 11 on the Billboard 200 with 22,000 copies sold while the 2-CD version available at Starbucks debuted at number 38 with more than 10,200 copies sold.




